Pride is among the trickiest of all human experiences. We should be proud of the good blessings in our lives and we should take pains to preserve them. But too much pride, which can lead us to think that we alone are responsible for those blessings, can become a devilish trap. How has pride either helped your life or hurt it?

Our two readings from the Hebrew scriptures are about brothers. Listen for the story about brothers in the New Testament lesson from Mark as well.

Psalm 133 is the shortest psalm at just three verses. It uses vivid imagery for the blessings that God has promised. This setting is a form of simplified Anglican Chant and can be found in the book *Psalms for All Seasons*.

James and John, brothers and accomplices, are sometimes called the "sons of thunder" in the New Testament. Do you have any guess to why this is the case?

Hymn 404 has a modern hymn text which seeks to describe the life of the church in all its diversity and complexity. Be sure to see the note at the bottom of the page in the Glory to God hymnal.

Our affirmation is taken from the Confession of 1967. It is one of the petitions about who and what we believe the church to be.
