### \*Moment of Silence

Today is Christ the King Sunday, the last Sunday of the liturgical year. Next week a “new” year begins with the first Sunday of Advent.

Psalm 100 is the archetype for all psalms of praise. The last 50 Psalms, Psalms 100 through 150, are often referred to as “the book of praise.” Each one builds upon the next until, at Psalm 150, the Bible tells us that “everything that breathes must praise the Lord.”

This hymn is the most traditional and important thanksgiving hymn. We sing it today to celebrate Thanksgiving and because its final stanza affirms the providence, majesty and wonders of God.

We use multiple resources for our worship. Often we write all of our liturgy—our worship language—ourselves. For several weeks our confessions have been adapted from the web resource *re:Worship*. Today’s confession includes a moment of silence. In this silence you are invited to pray your own personal confession, offering your heart and needs to God. In addition, our Assurance of Pardon, which is always part of our Confession, is responsive.

We trust in Jesus Christ,  
Fully human, fully God.  
Jesus proclaimed the reign of God:  
preaching good news to the poor  
and release to the captives,  
teaching by word and deed  
and blessing the children,

and binding up the brokenhearted,  
eating with outcasts,  
forgiving sinners,  
and calling all to repent and believe the gospel.  
Unjustly condemned for blasphemy and sedition,  
Jesus was crucified,  
suffering the depths of human pain  
and giving his life for the sins of the world.  
God raised this Jesus from the dead,  
vindicating his sinless life,  
breaking the power of sin and evil,  
delivering us from death to life eternal.

For several weeks our worship and scriptures have been primarily Christological - focused on the second person of the trinity, the Son. This affirmation of faith affirms what we believe and know to be true about Jesus. This affirmation was written in 1983 as the different branches of Presbyterianism reunited after more than 120 years of separation.
